- ◇ 4 consecutive semesters (21 months) as a full-time student
- ◇ A select cohort of 8 students each year (through the D&D Digital Spring Match)
- ◇ Exceeds the minimum 1200 hours of supervised practice experience necessary to become a Registered Dietitian Nutritionist

To be eligible you must have |

- ◇ Completed a didactic program in dietetics accredited by ACEND; received a verification statement of completion of the knowledge requirements or an intent to graduate statement
- ◇ A minimum undergraduate GPA of 3.0
- ◇ Completed an undergraduate or graduate course in statistics within the last 5 years
- ◇ Completed a medical nutrition therapy course within the last 5 years
- ◇ Taken the GRE and scored a minimum of 145 on both the verbal and quantitative portions of the exam, or have received special permission from the Department of Nutrition, Dietetics and Exercise Science
